 Logo, Website, Brochure development



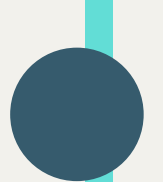

 By-Laws drafted for approval.



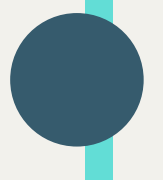

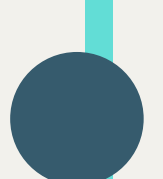

 to Yvette Schupbach



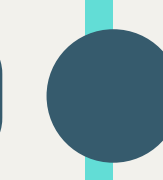

 ADAMHS Board and begins seeing participants.



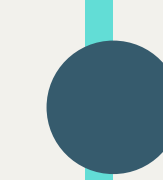

 and receives award for program start-up.



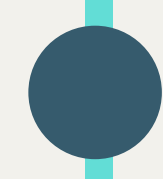
2020

BTW HUB begins work within grant. Applies and
 receives Level 1 Certification from the Pathways
 Community HUB Institute following Medicaid
 contracting with 4 plans and contracting with
 software system Care Coordination System.
 ODOT announced seeking rural agency for public
 transportation and Access Tusc applied and was
 awarded. Worldwide pandemic COVID-19 also took
 place at this time and in Spring of 2020 the State of
 Ohio conducted a mandated “lockdown.”



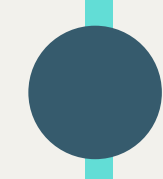
2021

Access Tusc Transit was launched in January of
 2022 (public transportation service funded by
 ODOT). By-Laws revised, removing Advisory
 Council paid memberships. BTW HUB
 completed its 2nd year of operations as Level 1
 certified HUB. Tusc County Directory of
 Services continued and published again for
 public. Facebook page launched and
 managed by contracted employee. J. Kinsey
 stepped down as Founder/Chair and filled
 Executive Director position. Paige (Frank)
 Dugan was hired as new HUB Director.
 Shannon Hursey was named Director of Transit.
 Employment grew to 15 individuals.

Today, we continue to serve residents from eight
 different counties with a variety of social services
 through wonderful community partners!



2022

BTW HUB receives recertification
 and now contracts with 11 partner
 agencies and 18 Community Health
 Workers. Transit grew by over 30% and
 grew fleet to 11 vehicles. Access Tusc
 was awarded 1.3 mil by Appalachian
 Regional Commission and now
 employs 24 staff.
