Access Tusc Transit continues to serve as a critical lifeline for residents throughout our rural community. For many individuals — including seniors, individuals with disabilities, and those without access to reliable personal transportation — this service is essential for maintaining access to healthcare and other vital services. Over the past year, we have experienced a **53%** increase in out-of-county trips. This substantial growth is primarily driven by the need for residents to travel north for medical appointments. As local healthcare options have become more limited, many individuals can no longer receive the care they need within our county and must now seek specialty and even routine medical care outside our local area.

For many in our community, rural public transportation is not a convenience — it is a lifeline. It ensures access to healthcare, supports independence, and helps residents maintain their quality of life despite the growing distance between them and essential services. We recognize and understand this growing need within our community. As individuals' needs and access shifts beyond county lines, we remain committed to adapting our services to meet residents where they are. Our team works diligently to ensure we are available, responsive, and dependable for those who rely on us. We continuously evaluate scheduling, routing, and resource allocation to ensure we can be there for the individuals who depend on our services.
